Parking / Gate:

There is ample parking at the facilitie. A \$5.00 weekend entry fee will be charged per person when parking. Also, two coaches per team will be given a pass. Children 12 and under will not be charged. Parking goes towards the facility for upkeep.

Player Gear:

Players and coaches are required to provide team gear. The tournament is providing game balls but warm up balls and equipment must be provided by each team.

Any catcher working with a pitcher is required to have a mask/helmet.

Game Times / Schedule Flexibility:

The event is using Tourney Machine and the online schedule is posted. If changes are necessary, we will send text blasts, through tourney machine ONLY (sign up for notifications – see below). As with any outdoor tournament, the weather is a factor. Therefore, the schedule can be changed at any time and for any reason. We hope this doesn't happen. Again, make sure you keep up to date by signing up for notifications. Parents and spectators may also sign up.

Teams MUST be ready to play when the game before them concludes. The tournament will run ahead of schedule if possible.

Safety:

Runners should use safety bag when there's a play at first and avoid unnecessary contact.

Runners should slide at home plate and avoid unnecessary contact. If the umpire sees unnecessary contact at the plate, the runner may be called out. This is a judgement call and is not disputable.

We try to post scores within 15 minutes of each games conclusion but need your help.

Rules:

- 5 gg 3 pool play followed by double elimination (weather permitting)
- 75 minutes finish the inning, weather permitting. Umpire keeps official time.
- Championship games 7 innings with no time limit (weather permitting)
- Metal cleats allowed
- Can bat roster all weekend. Non-sanctioned. Free defensive substitutions.
- Run rules of 12, 10, 8 after 3, 4, 5
- Latest ASA rules apply (Note courtesy runners can be anyone as of Jan 2018)
- Two (2) certified umpires per PP and Bracket games
- Three (3) certified umpires for all Championship games
- Pitching distances: 43'
- Home team determined by coin flip for PP
- Highest seed has choice for elimination play. If same seed, then coin flip.
- 1B safety bags will be in place and batters are expected to use orange bag and avoid contact.
- Umpire discretion calls cannot be protested.
- Pitchers get 3 warm-up pitches in each inning. A new pitcher gets 5.
- Courtesy runners may be used for pitchers/catchers
- Teams must quickly exit the field to make room for the next team.
- As with all tournaments, TD can change anything at any time for any reason
- Home team to keep official book and visiting team to confirm accuracy.
- PP games can end in a tie.
- Double elimination scheduled to start on Saturday.
- Check in one hour before 1st game. Need: 1) Insurance copy, 2) Concussion, 3) Birth Certs in case of challenge, 4) ASA number recorded (if have one)
- Refund Policy: Started games will be considered played. Refunds are per: 0 played=\$400, 1 played=\$275, 2 played=\$150, 3 or more=\$0 (based on full fee)
- Individual awards for 1st and 2nd place finishers
- Team awards for 1st and 2nd place finishers

Seeding:

All three PP games will be utilized to determine seeding. Seeding will be based on the following:


Record, H2H (2 teams only), RA, RD (8 max), RS, Coin Flip

Revert Back:

We recognize this can be aggravating but with the high cost of indoor venues, it's necessary to keep games on schedule so we can maximize complex usage.

To be fair and not to give unwarranted advantages to the visiting team, the score will be reverted back to the advantage of the home team. The only exception is if the home team is at bat at the drop-dead point and if the home team is in the lead or potentially ties before completing the inning. This rule is meant to protect the home team because they do not have the opportunity to get an equal number of offensive outs. Here are some examples:

Example 1: If the home team is losing going into the final inning but during the bottom of that inning, the home team takes the lead, then the partially completed inning DOES count.

Example 2: If the home team was in the lead before the final inning begins, then the visiting team takes the lead, then the home team begins their at-bat and re-takes the lead, then the partially completed inning DOES count.

Example 3: If the home team was in the lead before the final inning begins, then the visiting team takes the lead, then the home team begins their at-bat and ties the score, then the partially completed inning DOES NOT count. Score is reverted to point where the home team was winning.

Example 4: If the home team was losing in the previous inning and then ties the score in the partially completed inning, then the partially completed inning DOES count (tied game).

Example 5: If the visiting team is batting at drop dead point, the score is always reverted back to the previous inning.
