

## **Tournament Regulations for McCune Park**

All Mandatory and Suggested best practices presented in the Ohio Department of Health Responsible Restart Ohio for Baseball and softball will be adhered to. A copy can be found on our website www.canfieldbaseball.com for a copy of this document.

In addition the specific rules and policies will be enforced at McCune Park. Our number one goal is that the kids play in a safe and fun environment. While we respect everyone's right to an opinion this is not the venue to protest or display civil disobedience. The rules will not be up for interpretation, and they need to be followed and enforced by players, coaches, parents and spectators. We're all in this together and we want to continue to move forward.

- Players, parents, umpires and spectators must check their temperature before arriving at the park. If you or anyone in your household are sick or have a fever of 100.4 or higher STAY HOME and contact your medical professionals.
- Face Coverings strongly suggested to be worn by coaches, umpires, players (not in the field of play) and spectators.
- Families need to sanitize hands before arriving at the park and before games. Parents should have a personal hand sanitizer of their choosing for the kids to use. CBC will have hand sanitizing locations available.
- Tournament Director must sign a compliance form that they will follow the social distancing rules set by the Governor as well as specified rules for field use at McCune Park. It will be the Tournament Directors responsibility to have team's managers sign a compliance form.
- Tournament Directors need to have the information as mandated in the Responsible Restart Ohio directive for every umpire, player and coach at each game. In addition to Name, Phone, Address each participant must also list local contact for their Board of Health. In the event of an outbreak time is of the essence and a little planning can make a huge difference. This information can all be obtained prior to tournament.
- Team Managers must be responsible for the compliance of their team and fans.
- It is recommended that players, coaches and spectators return to their cars at the end of or between games.

- Tournament Director must have at least 1 person patrolling the complex as a compliance officer.
- Do not congregate before or after games. If your child is not playing we ask that you arrive and exit the park upon completion of your child's games.
- Each team will have designated practice areas before games and must take all equipment with them at conclusion of warm ups. No areas are permitted to be held for the day.
- No outside food or shared team water or coolers. Tents and umbrellas are permitted for shade but must only be used for individual families or within social distancing rules. If your team or child is not playing at the game you must vacate the area following the game to allow spectators for the current game and alleviate possible congestion points.
- Use of dugouts and restroom areas will adhere to the social 6 foot distancing guidelines.
  Dugouts and stands if in use will be sanitized following each game. Player areas will be marked off and parents not permitted in those areas.
- Portable restrooms will be rented at tournament expense to alleviate congestion areas at restrooms. The cost of the cleaning and maintenance will be a straight pass through expense.
- No sunflower seeds gum or any snacks that are not fully consumed.
- No Tobacco use especially chewing tobacco on the premises.
- No sharing of equipment of any kind. Manager/Parents will be responsible for supplying their own equipment.
- Stretching and pregame drills must follow the 6 foot social distancing guidelines.
- No physical contact between any participating players including but not limited to high 5's, handshakes, etc.
- Balls must be kept by each team to use during defense. Umpires will notify coaches when new ball is needed. Teams must retrieve their own foul balls or discontinue use of the ball retrieved by spectators.
- Spectators must bring their own chairs and keep appropriate distance.
- No team gatherings before or after games.
- "Tent Cities" are prohibited as is sharing of food, snacks or drinks outside of immediate family.
- Stands may be closed unless they can be safely maintained.
- Each field will have a designated player's area to maintain social distancing rules. These areas are prohibited from spectators.
- Those at risk according to the CDC should avoid the park or should remain in vehicles.
- Restrooms will be cleaned and sanitized per Health Department recommendations.
- A cleaning person will be hired to be on staff for the purpose of cleaning restrooms and common areas. This expense will be a straight pass through to the tournament.

If there is a rule violation the person will be asked to leave the park grounds and may return the following day. Repeat offenders will be asked to leave and incident report may be issued with police or health department if warranted.
