Thanksgiving Basketball Tournament

November 30th- Dec 1st 2019

Tournament Rules

- All Games- 15 minute Stop Time halves with 2 minute halftime.
- Each team will be allowed (3) 30 sec timeouts per game with 1 additional timeout for overtime. Timeouts do not carry over.
- Overtime will be 2 minutes long (No ties).
- Players will shoot two shots on the 10th Foul
- Players will foul out of the game on the 6th personal foul. Technical fouls count as personal fouls.
- Boys 7th-8th Grade use 29.5 ball. Boys 4th-6th Grade will use 28.5 ball.
- No full court press allowed if up by 15 points.
- 4th and 5th Grade: Man to man half-court defense only. *MetroWest Rules Apply Help and recover defense allowed. Man-to-man full court pressing is allowed in the last 2 minutes of each half. No zones allowed at any time, including during press. 1st offense will be a warning and 2nd offense will be a technical foul (Referee's discretion). No full court press allowed if up by 15 points.
- If game is more than 20 points with 2 minutes to go, game is running time until under.
- 1st team on schedule (on top or left) is Home team.
- Teams should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to their scheduled starting time.
- Tiebreaker: If 2 or more teams have the same record after pool play, then the 1st tiebreaker will be determined by the head-to-head record between the tied teams. The 2nd tiebreaker is the +/- System (*Note* - The most +/- points you can have in a game is 20. This is done so teams do not run up the score). The 3rd tiebreaker is the team with the lowest "points allowed" during the games played involving the tied teams. The 4th tiebreaker is a coin toss. *In a 3 team tie, if two top teams have same +/- then it goes back to H2H.

Note: There will be no tolerance for poor sportsmanship in the bleachers or on your bench directed towards the officials, players, or anyone else. Anyone asked to leave the gym by an official or the Tournament Director is prohibited from re-entering any of the tournament locations for the rest of the tournament. Coaches are responsible for the conduct of both players and parents.
