

HANFORD FLIGHT FRENZY TOURNEY
3 POINT, HOT SHOT & FT CONTEST RULES

Each team gets ONE different player in each contest. NO EXCEPTIONS!

3-POINT SHOOTOUT CONTEST RULES:

- Each shooter has 60 seconds to make as many 3-pointers as possible.
- Shooters will use the ball that they use in a regulation game: boys and girls 4th grade and under use a junior size ball (27.5"); boys in grades 5 & 6 & girls in grades 5th-HS use a women's basketball (28.5"); boys in grades 7-HS use a men's basketball (29.5").
- Each team must supply their own balls. Two balls maximum may be used by any one shooter.
- Each shooter may have up to 2 rebounders.
- Only a legal 3-point shot attempt will count – both feet behind the arc at the release of the ball.
- Shooters will get 5 attempts from 5 different spots on the court as determined by the Frenzy Staff. Each made shot counts as 1 point with the last ball (5th shot) counting as 2 points (money ball).
- There will be one boy winner and one girl winner.

HOT SHOT SHOOTING CONTEST RULES:

- Each shooter will have 60 seconds to make as many points as possible from designated spots.
- Shooters will use the appropriate ball as outlined above.
- Each spot will be assigned a point value from 1-5 points.
- Shooters must take at least one shot from each spot.
- Shooters may not shoot from the same spot twice in a row.
- Shooters get a 5 point bonus if they make at least one shot from each spot.
- There will be one boy winner and one girl winner.

FT CONTEST:

- Each shooter gets one attempt to make a FT. If they make the shot, they advance to the next round. A miss and the shooter is eliminated.
- Each shooter uses the appropriate ball as outlined above.
- Each round, shooters will switch ends of the court.
- Each shot must be a legal FT attempt as per the AAU rules for the shooter's grade: boys and girls in grades 2-4 will have a closer FT line designated by tape. Boys & girls in grades 5-8 may not cross the FT line until the ball hits the rim in order for the shot to count.
- When there are only 2 shooters left: if the first shooter misses, the second shooter must make his/her FT attempt to win. If the second shooter also misses, then both shooters get another chance. Equal attempts must be completed to declare a winner.
- There will be one boy winner in grades 5-8; one boy winner in grades 2-4; one girl winner in grades 5-8; and one girl winner in grades 2-4.
