

SUMMER 2021 COVID-19 TOURNAMENT SAFETY MEASURES

We look forward to hosting you this summer at a Trilogy Lacrosse Tournament. We are excited to be back on the field this summer. Our goal this summer is to mitigate risk and provide a fun and safe opportunity for the players to compete. We understand the last 15 months has been a challenge and much progress has been made over the last few months. We will continue to abide by any State and Local guidelines where we operate.

While the risk is generally lower, it is not eliminated. All attendees of Trilogy Lacrosse Tournaments knowingly and willfully assume the risks associated with participation in a Lacrosse Tournament. Trilogy Lacrosse will take every reasonable precaution to mitigate these risks and host the safest events possible in accordance with State, County and Local guidelines.

This document outlines our COVID-19 risk mitigation guidelines, policies and procedures for this summer. We ask that you read fully the guidelines detailed below and adhere to these policies. Guidelines change frequently and our policy below may be adjusted should these protocols change. We will provide an update specific to the event you are attending if any protocols below change for that event.

Spectator Policy + High Risk Individuals

- Spectators are allowed at events in accordance with current State guidelines.
- People at high risk for severe illness from COVID-19 should NOT attend our events.
- Due to the definition of the high risk population changing as more data comes in, below is the link from the CDC which outlines all high risk groups who should take extra precautions:

Symptom Screening + Waivers

- A completed electronic waiver must be submitted by a parent/guardian for every individual participating in
 the event prior to entering the venue. This waiver stipulates that participants and family members will not
 attend if any of the below conditions are met within 10 days of the event:
 - 1. They test positive for COVID-19
 - 2. They are in close contact with a positive case (excluded if you are vaccinated or have had COVID-19 in 3 months prior to exposure).
 - 3. They exhibit symptoms of COVID-19, which include but are not limited to a cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, loss of taste or smell, headache, chills, muscle or body aches and/or sore throat.

Shared Water

- There will be no shared water coolers located at field tables and access to shared refill stations will be limited or not available.
- All participants should bring their own labeled water, limited concessions will be on site

Medical Staff

• We have always taken the health and safety of players at our events very seriously and hire ample medical staff to accomplish this goal. We will have athletic trainers on-site at a 1 per 2 field ratio.

Face Coverings

- Wearing face coverings and masks protect others around you as well as yourself when social distancing cannot be maintained.
- All spectators, coaches, officials and athletes when not playing are encouraged to wear face coverings
 while in any indoor areas (such as restrooms) and crowded areas outside where social distancing is more
 difficult.

Social Distancing

- All players and spectators should maintain social distancing of 6' while on-site and not actively participating in game play.
- Participants should refrain from unnecessary physical contact with teammates, opposing coaches/players, officials, staff and fans such as handshakes, high fives, fist bumps, hugs, and goal celebrations.
- Tournament HQ is for staff only. Please only approach tournament HQ with matters of critical importance.

Inclement Weather

- All families should shelter in their vehicles during inclement weather.
- There will be no common shelter areas this year in order to eliminate crowding in contained areas.
- In the event there is a lightning strike within 10 miles of the facility, five (5) consecutive air horn blasts will sound and families will shelter in their cars and await further instruction which will be communicated through the Tourney Machine App.

Post Event COVID-19 Case Reporting

- Any attendee or staff member who was on-site at the event and tests positive for COVID-19 within 10 days
 of the event should report that positive test to Trilogy Lacrosse.
- If Trilogy Lacrosse is informed of a COVID-19 case, we will conduct contact tracing per CDC guidelines and notify the appropriate parties.

Tourney Machine

- Download the Tourney Machine App ahead of time for game schedules, field assignments, parking instructions and weather updates.
- Rules, maps, and COVID protocols will be available for download directly from Tourney Machine.
