

2022 Aurora Baseball Tournament

Turn-two Challenge Rules

- \$5.00 entry fee per participant (\$15.00 per group). Cash payment only. Must have an adult present to register.
- All three participants must be on the same roster of a team participating in the tournament.
- Each participant may only compete in one group.
- There is a maximum of 2 groups (6 participants) per team. Turn-two Official may issue exceptions.
- Each group will supply their own adult with a bat/fungo as their hitter.
- 8u, 9u, 10u, 11u and 12u will compete on 60ft bases. 13u and 14u will compete on 90ft bases.
- Balls will be supplied by the Aurora Baseball Tournament.
- Medals awarded to the Champions in each division (8U/9U/10U/11U/12U/13U/14U)
- All decisions by the Turn-two Official are FINAL.

Scoring

- The hitter must hit from inside a batter's box.
- All 3 players must start each attempt in "normal" fielding position and not move towards the play until the ball is hit.
 - Short stop can start no closer than even with the base path between 2nd and 3rd.
 - Second baseman must start on the first base side of the line closest to second base.
 - First baseman must start on the second base side of the line closest to first base.
- The ball must be hit to the shortstop and to the 3rd base side of the cone. The ball must hit the ground before the short stop fields it.
- The shortstop must throw to the second baseman. The second baseman must record the forced out at second base before throwing to the first baseman.
- Time will begin when the ball is hit, and stop when the out is made at first base.
- Each group will have 5 attempts. The fastest of the 5 times will be the official time for the group.
- A swing and miss by the hitter will not count as an attempt. All other contact will count as an attempt.
- A ball that is hit to the second base side of the cone will count as an attempt but the time will not be recorded.
- The fastest time in the division will be the Champions.
- If there is a tie, each group will add their fastest three times together. The group with the fastest combined times will be the Champions.
